I thank you for your letter, addressed to Mr. N. Purushothaman, Pro-Vice-Chancellor who has passed it on to me. Enclosed please find a copy of the biography of Dr. John Matthai written by Dr Haridasan with compliments of the Committee.

Dr. John Matthai Centre is a Centre of the University of Calicut set up in the 17 acre plot made available to the University on payment of a paltry sum by Mrs. John Matthai. It houses the Department of Economics of the University of Calicut where M.A. programme is offered in Economics and Applied Economics. There are also facilities for research for the award of Ph.D. degree. It also houses the 'School of Drama' which offers instruction for the award of the Degree of 'Bachelor of Theatrical Arts'. This is probably the only institution in the country which offers a degree in Theatrical Arts.

Dr. John Matthai is one of the best contribution which Kerala made to India. Unfortunately, he has been forgotten; at least not remembered the way he should have been. The centenary celebrations were a sincere attempt to bring back to life the memory of Rexembered this great man. I am now on the job of setting up a 'John Matthai Memorial Society', so that the memory of Dr. Matthai could be perpetuated. I take this opportunity to seek your guidance, help and advize in making the functioning of the Society successful.

We are shortly releasing a Souvenir published in connection with the centenary celebrations. I shall send a copy as soon as it is ready.

Meanwhile if it is not too much to ask. I wonder whether you will be able to send some details about the work and life of Dr John Matthai at the London School. Photostat copies of any relevant document or papers like written by Dr. John Matthai and photographs will be of immense help and use.

Dr. Tom Mossiter of the London School of Economics had visited the Dr John Matthai Centre in 1983. Tom Mossiter happens to be a friend of mine and our association started when I was in the Cambridge University in 1970. Perhaps, it will not be a sad idea if you can have a chat with Mr. Tom Mossiter.

As Dr. Matthai was the first Indian student to take the D.Sc. degree from LSE under the guidance of Sidney Webb, we are, of course, greatly interested in knowing how his memory continues to live. I would greatly appreciate it if you could please send me details about the activities and aims of the Dr. John Matthai Centre, the centenary celebrations, and the biography of Dr. Matthai written by Dr. V. Now you are getting a little white". ¹⁸ The 150 rupees provided by his brother was insufficient for his maintenance, and therefore he had to seek part-time employment to supplement the meagre allowance. This he found in the India Office, London, the seat of the Secretary of State for India. At that time (1913–15) the India Office was planning constitutional reforms in India and John Matthai was employed in collecting materials for the proposed reform, for which he was paid around £ 400 per annum. With that money he was able to lead a modest life in London.

After completing his studies in London, John Matthai went to Balliol College¹⁹, Oxford to obtain the degree of B.Litt. He was interested only in imbibing the atmosphere of Oxford and earning a degree. At that time the Master of Balliol was A. L. Smith, a distinguished scholar of the day. John Matthai had an interview with A. L. Smith when he sought admission and naturally he spoke of his D.Sc. work in the London University. But A. L. Smith had a poor opinion about degrees from the London University and asked John Matthai whether he had any other qualification to claim for admission. He was admitted to Balliol on the strength of his degrees from the Madras University! London University, it may be mentioned, was a recent one and was later made famous by Sydney Webb, Harold Laski and others. The real centres of learning at that time were Oxford and Cambridge. An incident which happened at the time of interview was narrated by John Matthai to a close acquaintance. Matthai was anxious to get admission to the Balliol College and told A.L. Smith: "Sir I have been a rolling stone all along" and Smith replied: "That is good, a rolling stone gathers no moss and so is not spoiled". John Matthai was admitted to the degree of the Oxford University on 28 June 1917.

There were around sixty Indians at Oxford at that time. Some of them became famous later, such as P. T. Rajan, K. M. Panikkar and Dewan Chamanlal. Apart from K. M. Panikkar, there were two other Malayalees as well—V. K. Krishnan Thampi, a brother-in-law

of the Maharaja of Travancore and V. K. Raman Menon, a son of the Maharaja of Cochin. As a student he took an active part in the debates of the Oxford Union Society. He was in the opposition group and the members of the opposition decided to make fun of the ruling group whenever a debate took place. He told one of his acquaintances later that he used the same tactics sometimes in the Indian Legislature to disarm the opposition.

After completing the studies at Oxford, John Matthai made a study of co-operative movement and spent about a year in Ireland under Horace Plunkett, the famous exponent of co-operative movement. It was strongly rumoured at that time that he was being considered for appointment as a Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for India, but somehow it did not materialise. Had he been appointed, he would have been able to influence the policy of the Secretary of State to the advantage of India and its people. But that was not to be. His destiny lay elsewhere. John Matthai returned to India in 1918.

John Matthai had gone to England for higher studies; he returned with a vast deal more than the two degrees he earned. The experiences in England and Ireland were to stand him in good stead in later years. His independence of thought and action and the determination to push on regardless of and despite seemingly overwhelming odds were forged on the lawns of Oxford, in the corridors of India Office and the craggy recesses of Ireland. His wit and knack of quick repartee were sharpened in the forums of the Oxford Union Society. When his original allowance dwindled, he took a part-time job; when he had no one to turn to, he decided to help himself. All these traits were no doubt already there in him; only they were turned to a vibrant pitch by his experiences abroad. The job at the India Office, though only a part-time one, gave an insight into the problems afflicting his motherland from an entirely new angle. It made him a more complete man: self-reliant and confident.
